Class Descriptions

Open–For the purpose of this show, any class designated as Open, refers to eligible Gypsy Cobs, Drum Horses, Gypsy Cob or Drum Horse Part-Breds, or ID Horses.  
ID – Refers to horses holding a GCDHA Identification Certificate, for the purposes of producing Drum Horses.

Jog in the Park (ridden) – Inspired by a time when the place to be seen and to “flash” your good horse or elaborate attire was in the park. Horse and rider should give the impression of being elaborately turned out in one’s best dress attire for the purpose of making an impression. It’s all about the flash! Tack and Attire may be from any period or region, real or imagined, and need not be authentic but should be reminiscent of a time when success was measured by the flash of a horse’s step and the elegance of the rider. Judged 25% on rider’s attire, 25% on horse’s tack/turnout, 35% on movement and overall appearance, 15% on manners.

Trot in the Park (driven) – Same as Jog in the Park but driven rather than ridden.

Musical Freestyle – Rider/Driver provides CD with music and performs a choreographed routine, matched to music. Recommended performance time is 3 – 4 minutes from the time the music begins. Costumes and/or themes are encouraged and performances will be judged upon the quality and difficulty of the movements, musicality, originality and overall impression. Audience is encouraged to let the judge know their favorites!

In-Hand Traditional Movement – Judged 30% on type, 20% on presentation and 50% on traditional movement, as preferred by the Gypsy founders of the breed. Movement should be on the flash with good flex in the knees and hocks, legs coming up (the higher the better) and then continuing in a forward motion for maximum reach. Weighted shoes or artificial appliances are strictly prohibited.

Liberty Class – Exhibitor to provide music. At the start of the music, the horse will be released to display his personality, movement and enthusiasm. Handler plus 1 helper are allowed in the ring. They may encourage the horse but may not touch him. Music to play for not more than 2 minutes. Time will be called. When the music stops, the handler will have 2 minutes to catch the horse, baiting allowed. Horses who cannot be caught within 2 minutes are disqualified.

\$150 Pleasure Driving Stake –Horses entered in this class must have been entered, shown and judged in classes 38 or 39. The prize money will be paid by check within 30 days of the show to the owner as listed on the entry form. Checks must be cashed within 60 days. The stake money will be paid out as follows: 1’st = \$60 2’nd = \$45 3’rd = \$30 4’t’h = \$15

English Show Hack - The ideal English Show Hack Horse possesses vitality, presence, animation, superme quality, excellent performance and impeccable manners. Every dimension of this individual is balanced. Extended and collected gaits are required and the English Show Hack horse must be able to perform all of the gaits with a noticeable transition between the normal, collected and extended gaits. Normal Walk, Collected walk, Extended Walk, Normal Trot, Collected Trot, Extended Trot, Normal Canter, Collected Canter, Extended Canter, Hand Gallop. Obedience to the rider is of prime importance. English saddles of any type are allowed, Hack attire and formal attire (shadbelly coat) are accepted. Horses may be shown with a braided mane or tail but it is not required. Decorations are prohibited.

#### ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Golf Cart Rental –Exhibitors interested in renting a golf cart during the show may contact the Show Secretary for further information.

Rules – This show will use the GCDHA Show Rules. If there are specific questions that need clarification prior to the start of the show, please feel free to ask.

Health Papers – ALL ENTRIES ARE REQUIRED to present a current negative Coggins. Entries traveling from outside of Oregon must also present a current Health Certificate.

Registration Requirements – All Gypsy Cobs must be registered in at least one of the following registries: GCDHA, GHRA, GVS, GHA.

All Drum Registries are welcomed at A North American Gypsy Affaire.
